MAN KILLED BY LITTLE GIRL

Daughter of Thornton, R. L. Policeman Shoots Elber Brigs, Who Had Broken Into House.

THORNTON, R. L., Nov. 29.—Ethel Smith, the 15-year-old daughter of Special Policeman Leander Smith, is under arrest tonight at the home of Chief of Police Rowland Kimball, charged with killing Elber Brigs, a resident of Thornton.

The tragedy today was the culmination of an estrangement between Brigs and his wife. About two weeks ago Brigs is alleged to have deserted his wife, leaving her without means to support herself.

This afternoon, during the absence of Smith, Brigs arrived at the Smith house and demanded admission. Charles Halliday, a negro cook, started to bring Chief of Police Kimball to the scene, leaving in the house Mrs. Brigs and her children.

Ethel procured her father's revolver, a thirty-two calibre weapon. As soon as Halliday was out of sight Brigs again demanded admittance. This being refused he drew a large calibre revolver from beneath his coat and cut away the netting from the screen on the front door.

Brigs fired three more shots, every bullet taking effect, and Brigs staggered back and fell down.

Switch Engine Runs Amuck Locomotive Beyond Control Causes Two Weeks and Kills Two Men in Winnepesaukee.

ST. PAUL, Nov. 29.—A Winnepesaukee, Man. special to the Pioneer Press says: A runaway engine in the Canadian Northern yards today caused two wrecks, killed two men and seriously injured four others.
