They fear that the rullroads, already hampered by a car shortage, will be unable to handle it. Sorn is expected to begin coming in large conductities in the next two weeks and a refitable flood of the golden grain is exsected to flow out of Omaha through the atter half of December.

Owing to the tardiness with which corn s moving as a result of the tremendous crop the milroads, it is pointed out, will nave less excuse for not hastening to the rescue of coal consumers. Many towns in Nebraska are reported as being destitute of coal and the roads have said they were helpless to relieve the situation because of car famine. Since they are not obliged o devote a great number of their cars just now to corn hauling, it is said they could ump in and dispose of the coal famine and be amply prepared to meet the demand for corn cars when the rush came.

Burlington is Helping. General Agent Vallery of the Burlington n Denver is in Omaha and says the coat situation should be relieved somewhat if the united efforts of Burlington officials all along the line can do anything for the trouble which now faces the users of coal. He said that during the last three days the Burlington had turned over to the Denver & Rio Grande 971 empty cars at Denver to be taken to the mines.

Every person who collects fare on any street railway shall, at the time he receives the same, ask and ascertain from the passenger whether or not the passenger desires a transfer. Any person, co-partnership or corporation, motorman, conductor or other person in charge of any street car who shall, upon request, refuse to issue such transfer slips at the time and in the manner herein provided, of to accept such transfer slips as in lieu of one fare, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemganor and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not to exceed \$20 or imprisonment not more than twenty days.

S. R. Johnson of San Jose, Cal., is in Omaha visiting with his son, Frank B. Johnson of the Omaha Printing company. Mr. Johnson is one of the few men new living who set foot on Nebraska soll as they crossed the Missouri river near Nebraska City in 1847. After a short stay in this ter-ritory Mr. Johnson returned to Iowa and returned again to Nebraska in 1854.
