Increase in Visible and Belief Obtains that December Contracts Will Be Filled Without Trouble

"Trade was light early with market of a holiday character." says the Exchange Grain company in its daily letter, "but buying orders were filled with offerings in excess of demand, no attention being paid to light receipts northwest or small world shipments. Scalpers soid some. There was a little buying by commission houses, but with expected increase in the visible and the belief that December contracts will be filled without any trouble. There was a weak feeling and the absence of outside buying was a bear factor. Market closed weak and lecks lower".

Selling of corn by some large cash houses sarty found but few huvers aside from scalpers, and while trade was light the market displayed decidedly weak symptoms on reported larger country offerlings. There were a few resting buying orders in hands of commission houses, but close was weak with sentiment not nearly so bullish.

"There was some buying of oats early by cash houses, but the bearish government report still had its effect, causing the withdrawal of many resting buying orders and creating liquidation as well. Possibly the latter was due to reports from the west, especially Nebraska, that farmers are selling more freety, which created timidity."
