Commissioner George L. Miller took an interest in the case and recommended leniency on account of Brugmann's general good record and his family.

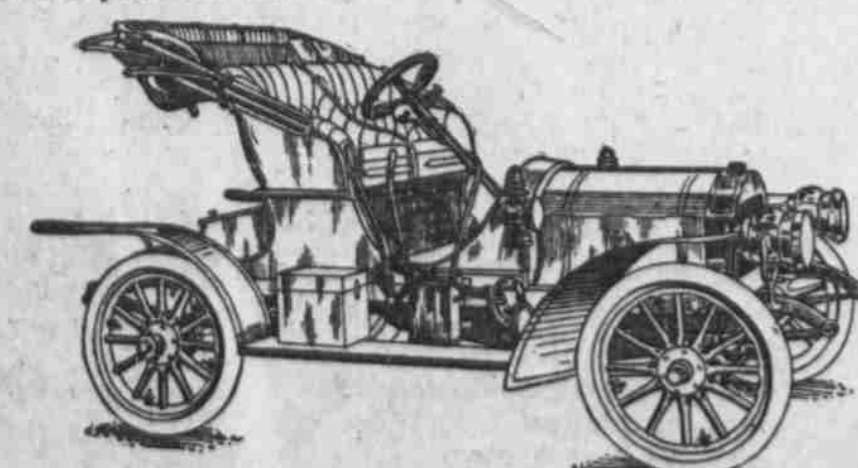
