

NEW YORK STOCKS AND BONDS

Market Depressed Early in Day by Rumors of Possible Failures. RATE FOR CALL MONEY AGAIN ADVANCES Recoveries Follow Announcement of Passing of All Balance Sheets by Clearing House—Closing Tone is Firm.

NEW YORK, Dec. 31.—The last day of the year did not pass without a pinch in the money market and this was a constraint on the stock market. But more influence on sentiment was caused by the persistent rumors of financial embarrassment growing out of stock market losses. Before the day was over it was more to be understood that arrangements had been concluded to avoid the threatened embarrassment. The relief to speculative sentiment was manifest and the tone of depression in the market largely cleared. The recovery was followed by more a matter of price readjustment than a response to any large transactions. There were some fluctuations in the opening dealing, successive transactions being made at a point and a half, an unusual fluctuation for an active stock in large volume in the market. The sharp rally in the market came without any official announcement of steps taken, but was accepted as a turn of the market. The atmosphere of the market was not a cheerful one for the approach of the new year. A heavy demand for gold for Brazilian account also is to be faced. In our own market also it is recalled that the last deposit of \$100,000,000 of treasury funds was fixed for return on January 30 for half the amount and for February 1 for the remainder. The \$25,000,000 deposited late in September also was with the intimation that demand for recall would be made when currency began to return from the interior in the spring. Installments on subscription for new York issues will make heavy demand from time to time on future money markets. The question of working towards ease in the money market therefore remains somewhat obscure. The time money was again easier today and sterling rate was strong.

The more cheerful tone of the later stock market was maintained and the closing tone was strong and at the best prices of the day. Bonds were heavy. Total sales, par value, \$1,722,000. United States bonds were unchanged on call.
