RECOMMENDATIONS BY FOLK

Governor of Missouri Offers Suggestions for Laws to the Legislature.

PRIMARY AND REGISTRATION DESIRED

Municipal Ownership of All Public Utilities is Favored and Legislation Asked to Make it Feasible.

JEFFERSON CITY, Mo., Jan. 3.—Governor Folk in his message to the legislature today recommended a number of acts relating to life insurance companies, among others a standard policy for all life companies, prohibiting discriminating rebating, regulating the selection of directors and requiring nonresident companies to keep at least 70 per cent of the premiums received from Missouri policyholders invested within the state.
