WHY BOX RENTS ARE RAISED Palmer Says Government Wishes to Encourage Carrier Belivery

"One of the reasons for the big increase a the rental price of postoffice boxes that has just gone into effect," says Postmaster Palmer, "is to adjust the rates more equitably. In all the larger cities the box rentals have been increased even to a greater extent than in Omaha. These boxes occupy a great deal of space that could be utilized for more convenient purposes for the public. Then again the government wishes to encourage the carrier delivery system for the sole purpose of its greater

convenience to the public and the more expeditious delivery of the mails. "While on the postoffice subject I wish t were possible to educate the public up to the knowledge of the uselessness of the substation postoffices, particularly here in Omaha. We have, as you know, four of these substations; one at Fortieth and Cuming, one at Lake and Twenty-fourth streets, one on Vinton street and the other at Twenty-ninth and Leavenworth streets. Admitting that these substations are a convenience on Sundays, they certainly are not so on week days. By doing away with them it would call in thirty additional carriers to the main office, and carrier deliveries could be made more promptly by would be a saving of \$2,500 monthly expense in rentals and other incidentals.
