LOCAL BANKS COMPLAIN THEY HAVE TOO MUCH CITY MONEY AT PRESENT.

CASH REPRESENTS PROCEEDS OF BONDS

Annexationists Discussing the Advantages of Forming a Club to Further the Interests of a Greater City.

Frank Moriarty of the Packers National bank made the statement a few days ago that his institution and the other banks of the city had too much of the funds of the city. Notwithstanding the large deposit of the city funds, they were in no ways a permanent fund. Most of the money came from the sale of city securities. The average for the two months before December of last year was \$300,000. Of this amount \$250,000 was from the sale of the sewer bonds, \$50,000 was the amount remaining of the city hall fund after the purchase of the city hall site at \$15,000; \$50,000 was the amount in the Missouri avenue paving fund. Deducting this from the full amount, the normal deposit would be only \$25,000. This has been the usual average of the deposit. With the close of the year and the payment of the annual tax levy of course this amount is a much greater figure, as it is every year. But notwithstanding this the deposits are not unusually large if the funds which have been raised for special purposes are taken out. South Omaha has ample funds, but the impression that there is a great surplus in the treasury of the city is an error.

Annexation Club Talked Of. The more prominent citizens who are at present favoring a union of the interests of the two cities are at present speculating on the necessity of forming an annexation club. At present they are waiting only on the attitude of the legislature. It is obvious that if the legislature intends to settle the matter at the present session there is no need of such an organization; but if other action is determined on the club is ready to organize. The sentiment for immediate annexation is making less opposition, according to the statements of several of the champions of immediate union. When the agitation began many were inclined to berate the idea, but now they are willing to listen to the facts. They recognize that there are two ways to the question.
