CAPTAIN JOHN S. WOOD DIES

Pioneer Rounds Out Forty Years of Residence in Omaha.

DEATH FROM COMPLICATED DISEASES

Veteran of Civil War, Ardent Republican, Once City Clerk of Omaha and Incumbent of Federal Positions.

Captain John S. Wood, one of Omaha's most prominent pioneer citizens, died about 8 a. m. Tuesday at his home, 38 North Twenty-fourth street, after an extended illness from a complication of diseases. He was 60 years of age and is survived by a widow, a son, John S. Wood, Jr., who is on the United States ship Colorado, stationed at Manila, and three daughters, Mrs. Arthur Wynne of Omaha, Mrs. E. E. Ruggles of Roxbury, Mass., and Mrs. A. J. Noble of Chicago.

Captain Wood came to Omaha about forty years ago and held several public offices, always having taken an active interest in politics, in which he was an ardent republican. During the first term of Judge Berka as police magistrate Captain Wood was clerk of the police court. He was also elected and served one term as city clerk about twenty years ago, as well as having occupied several federal positions.

In former years Captain Wood was possessed of considerable wealth and occupied a residence at Twenty-eighth street and Capitol avenue, which was then one of the largest residences in Omaha. For many years he was the proprietor of a large harness manufacturing establishment at Fourteenth and Harney streets, but lost considerable of his wealth through the defalcation of persons in public life for whom he had given bond.

Veteran of Civil War.

Captain Wood was a veteran of the civil war, enlisting at the beginning of the war with the seventh Pennsylvania volunteers and serving until the close of hostilities, when he had been promoted to a captaincy and had served with distinction. His regiment was attached to the Department of the Potomac and was engaged in all the important battles of the war. He bore twenty-seven gunshot wounds at the time of his death which were received during the war, one of which had caused him to be crippled in one leg.

Definite arrangements for the funeral have not been made as yet, but services probably will be held Friday at the Second Presbyterian church. A daughter, Mrs. A. J. Noble of Chicago, will arrive Wednesday to be in attendance at the funeral, but the other daughter living out of the city, Mrs. Ruggles of Roxbury, Mass., will not be able to attend, on account of the serious illness of her husband.

Base Ball Player Robbed.

CHICAGO, Feb. 19.—Michael Donlin, member of the New York National League baseball team, was robbed last night of \$500 in North. Smith, a diamond studded by a stranger. The man, who gave the name of J. F. Smith, and his residence as New York, told Donlin that he had just arrived from New York and was without money or friends. His story aroused the sympathy of Donlin and he invited Smith to share his room last night. This morning when Donlin awoke he found Smith, one money and the stud had disappeared. He reported the matter to the police and Smith was later arrested.
