# NAMES ASSAILANT AND DIES

Dominic Filbo, Stabbed at Christening, Accuses John Maseare and Passes Away.

Dominic Filbo, the Italian who was stabbed in the abdomen in an encounter with a fellow countryman at a christening on the night of March 2, died at St. Joseph's hospital at 1:30 o'clock Monday afternoon, after reasserting his assatiant to be John Mascaro, the man held by the police. Filbo was in a low condition for two days following the stabbing when he began to rally and his recovery was confidently expected. Sunday night, however, the end became apparent and Filbo was

asked to make a statement in the presence of witnesses, which he did. Secrecy has been a marked trait of all those who were supposed to have been in the vicinity of the scene at the time of the cutting and the information the police have been able to gather has been meager and only on matters of small importance, by no

means incriminating to anyone. This they were able to learn, however, that a christening held at Masoarco's home, neighbor, was attended, uninvited, by Dominic Filbo. The intruder was sent away upon his appearance, but he soon returned house. Filbo received his wound then and when his death seemed probable he ac-cused Mascaro of the deed, Mascaro was arrested but released on bonds when Filbo's recovery appeared probable. He was again ocked up Monday morning when word was

received that it was expected the victim would die. The dead Italian was under middle age and unmarried. He worked in the yards of
