Saturday's Rally was Due Largely to Buying by Bears Who Had Sold Short to the Last Minute.

NEW YORK, March 18.—There was a marked abatement of excitement in the markets in stocks today from the enormous transactions and wild price fluctuations of last week. The price movement still showed a degree of feverishness, but the effect of last week's turbulent market, and the reduction in the volume of the day's sales is convincing evidence of the setting back of the market into more normal conditions.
