BURGLAR IS SOON ARRESTED

Within Hour After Crime He is Caught by Detectives Ferris and Dunn. MAN SUSPECTED OF SERIES OF DEEDS. Detectives of Police and Savage of Detectives Lead in Pursuit of What Officers Did.

Within an hour after having broken into and robbed the home of E. T. Swobe, 108 South Thirty-sixth street, William Howard was arrested as the burglar at Union station with the stolen goods in his possession by Detectives Ferris and Dunn by a clever piece of sleuth work at 2 o'clock Monday morning.

When a telephone message reached the police station from the Swobe residence that burglars had been in the house, the two officers were sent to investigate. Gathering what information they could, they followed an idea which looked to them like a chance and made a hurry trip to the depot. There, in the check room, was a suit case recently left by a man. It was very heavy. The detectives placed themselves where they could see and hear all, and after a wait of some time their vigil was rewarded by the appearance of the man they wanted.

Howard was taken to the police station and when the suit case was opened it was found to contain the goods stolen from the Swobe residence. Another trip which Howard had with him contained his personal effects and jewelry believed to have been stolen from other houses. In his pockets were also articles which may prove to be loot of housebreakings. The articles taken from Howard were easily identified by him when he called at the police station Monday morning.

Man Who Did Other Deeds. That Howard is the man who has troubled residents in different parts of the city is the opinion of Chief of Police Donahue and Chief of Detectives Savage. The home of Harry S. Waller, 220 Benzie park, was entered recently and goods found on Howard were recognized as being part of the loot. Scarcely has a night passed for two weeks or more that some clever job was committed and the police are sure Howard was the man in each case. Detectives Ferris and Dunn took the lucky depot trail on the possibility that they were after the same man who had done the other recent burglaries. The police had never been able to learn any more than that goods were shipped out of the city by express immediately after a burglary, and when they found that a suit case had been stolen from the Swobe home, in which to place the stolen goods, they

ROADS GRANT RATES AT LAST. Western Lines Concede Special Fares for Sugar Beet Workers. PROTECT NEW FACTORIES OF THE WEST. Refuse to Make Concessions to Workers Going to Michigan Because of Small Plants in Northwest.

Creigh Visits Andersonville. Site of Famous Prison Has Been Converted into Beautiful Park. Captain T. L. Creigh has recently returned from an extended trip through the south. One of the points visited was the site of Andersonville prison, where 13,000 union soldiers perished while prisoners of war within the confederate lines. Mr. Creigh said: "The grounds now comprise some eighty acres, including the twenty-seven acres of the prison pen proper, in which were herded at one time 29,000 union soldiers. The grounds have been purchased by the Woman's Relief corps and beautified. The National cemetery there contains 13,000 graves of known dead and 800 unknown dead union soldiers who perished in the prison and vicinity. Providence spring has been beautified with marble fountains and other suitable surroundings. The graves of the dead are suitably marked, such as are known, as well as the unknown graves. Throughout the grounds are tablets marking scenes and incidents of the prison, including the famous dead line, the old hospital where the six 'traitors' were tried and executed. The keeper's residence is on the spot where Wirt had his official headquarters. The grounds are most carefully kept, and are a beautiful memorial of one of the saddest tragedies of modern warfare. The government maintains the National cemetery there, while the National Woman's Relief corps looks after the care of the grounds. It is quite certain that the proposed monument to Wirt will not be erected anywhere near the grounds, and I question if such a monument will ever be erected. The southern people are not particularly proud of him, and this is especially true of the confederate soldiers who were very little in favor of the name or memory of Captain Wirt."

Steel Cars Satisfactory. A report is being prepared for the service rendered by the two new steel freight cars which the Union Pacific built at the Omaha shops and which have been given a try-out on the road. The preliminary report is they are very satisfactory. Work also has newly begun on the construction of the new motor cars which were ordered some time ago and also on five trailers for these. These motor cars will have 200 horse power motors, the same as No. 8, which is now doing service between Beatrice and Lincoln.

Plans of New Girls' Home. Nearly Half the Equipment is Now Provided, Says Mrs. J. M. Cudahy. Mrs. Joseph M. Cudahy spoke before the social science department of the Woman's club Monday afternoon on the new club for self-supporting young women being organized and to be opened May 1 at Forest Hill, the new building on 24th and County Sts. Cudahy said that nearly half the equipment of the house already has been provided through the kindness of interested friends and she was confident the rest would be forthcoming in time. In addition to the permanent rooms for between forty and fifty young women, a dormitory with accommodations for eight or ten, to be used for young women strangers coming to the city until they can find permanent suitable homes. Accommodations in the club will cost from \$4.50 to \$5 a week, according to the room. Breakfast will be used as the regular setting and living room. The grounds will comprise about one square block, including a tennis court. Mrs. Cudahy explained that the club would be in a way supplementary to the Young Women's Christian association and wished it especially understood that it is to be entirely self-supporting and self-governing and in no way a charitable institution. Mrs. Joseph M. Cudahy, Mrs. W. T. Page, Mrs. Edward P. Peck, Mrs. Stella Hamilton and Mrs. Charles C. George constitute the board of trustees.
