MANY NEW LAWS FOR IOWA

Thirty-second General Assembly Passes More Important Bills Than Predecessors. CORPORATIONS ARE GENERALLY AFFECTED

Laws Governing Railroads and Insurance Concerns and Cities of State Are Altered in Marked Manner.

(From a Staff Correspondent.) DES MOINES, Ia., April 10.—(Special.)—That which history will probably pronounce the most important session of the general assembly ever held in Iowa came to a close yesterday. To this statement the criticism will be offered that a session is frequently viewed this way at all times. When Governor Cummins addressed the house yesterday in presenting a gavel to Speaker Kendall, he made the statement that the Thirty-second general assembly had passed more bills in the interests of the people than any other general assembly in Iowa, and there is evidence in the bills passed to bear out his statement.

Something over 200 bills, eight joint resolutions and one resolution recommending a pardon were passed. When one has made a careful investigation of the bills that have passed the Iowa legislature and have become laws he will not say but that three months of very active lawmaking have been indulged in.

In addition to passing a primary election law that is as strong as that of any state in the union, the legislature will be known for its laws affecting railroads, corporations, insurance and city governments. Here is a record of these measures:

Railroad Bills Passed. A little investigation of the railroad bills will suffice to show the thoroughness with which the legislature took hold of such matters. Briefly this is the record on railroad bills passed:

An anti-pass bill that prohibits everybody from riding on passes except officers of the roads and their employes and excludes laborers working for the roads unless they are on the payroll of the principal part of the road.

A 2-cent maximum passenger fare bill which provides for 2 cents a mile on the larger roads, with 25 cents on some and 3 cents on others of the smaller roads.

A bill restricting the power of railroads to investigate the entire subject of freight rates.

Ordering the railroad commission to put in force a schedule of joint freight rates.

Prohibiting against interstate discriminations in freight rates.

A bill restricting the number of hours of continuous employment of men working in the operation of railroads to 10 hours per day.

A bill authorizing the railroad commission to regulate and fix rates for express companies.

In addition to these there were bills requiring railroads to put in track scales at convenient points, requiring them to place the weights along the right-of-way, and placing on them the burden of proof as to whether or not they have cars, besides numerous other bills, practically all of which are in the interests of the common people.

Laws Governing Corporations. Many of the bills relating to corporations and controlling corporations also apply to railroads. Chief among these is the bill that prohibits any corporation contributing money for political campaign purposes.

A bill prohibiting combinations of corporations or companies with the view to fixing the price or controlling the market on grain.

A bill that puts life into the anti-trust law and makes it compulsory on the railroad to file a schedule of its rates.

A bill providing that notice of suit against a corporation can be served upon any of its agents, making it impossible for a corporation to avoid suit by hiding its corporate status.

Defining the relation of employer and employee as to the assumption of risk and prohibiting the employer from releasing the employee that the place where he works or the machinery with which he works is dangerous to his life.

A bill providing against watered stock by prohibiting the sale of stock unless it is paid for in full in cash or else have the approval of the executive council.

A bill prohibiting stock-tops and fixing a penalty.

An anti-tipping bill.

Laws for Cities. The cities of the state got ample attention in the bills that were passed. Satisfied with their present form of government, which recognizes the legislature, administrative and judicial, they are at liberty if they have a population of 25,000 or over of adopting the commission plan of government, wherein all the functions of government are lodged in a mayor and four councilmen.
