Old Suit Growing Out of Tom Sloan's Affair Will Be Argued in May.

The United States district attorney has just received from the attorney for the Indians in the case of Charles Green Rainbow against M. Young, sheriff of Thurston county, for presentation to the circuit court of appeals. The suit will be argued at St. Paul early in May.

The suit grows out of the arrest and detention of Mr. Sloan from the Winnebago Indian reservation agency house last summer, where he had gone to collect a claim against some Indians on annuity pay day. A rule of the Indian department prohibits collectors from being within one hundred or more yards of the agency house during these pay days and Sloan was ordered removed from the premises by the Indian police, of which Charles Green Rainbow was one.

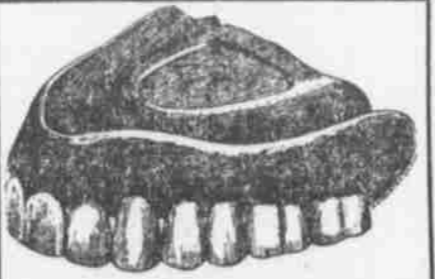
