Eharp Decline in Dull Wheat Market After Strong Opening.

USUAL SATURDAY LIQUIDATION ENSUES

Profit Taking Sales and Few Committee ments Over Sunday Cause Deeline, Although Crop Conditions Are Unchanged.

OMAHA, April 27, 1907.

The market had another wild opening, but the usual Saturday Equidation ensued and prices declined under heavy realisting sales. Corn and oats were in little demand and closed weak, while the close in wheat was nearly at the low point for the day. Receipts were moderate and there was no change in the condition of crops, but cables responded to the sharp rise of yesterday.

Wheat opened strong and higher on account of the continued absence of rain in the southwest, but the gain was not held and the market sagged under profit-taking sales and little support offered. The market was quiet and dull after the opening, as investors preferred to hold off and local traders sold out long lines in fear of rains over Bunday. Slight showers were reported in Missouri, but precipitation was predicted only for Nebraska, lowa and Missouri. It was believed that damage reports have been exaggerated and that the Kansas crop is only two weeks late and in fair condition to respond well to heavy rains. Sales of 300,100 bushels of wheat at seaboard for export were reported.
