to Provide Relief for Conditions in Navy.

WASHINGTON, May 29-Surgeon General Rixey is endeavoring to have the hospital ship Relief put in commission for the care of the sick of the navy. It is urgently needed at present at Norfolk where the naval hospital is to be rebuilt, its present condition being such as to unfit it for the care of the sick and injured of the service. A hospital ship stationed there for the next two years can be sent with patients to the other hospitals and return to cars for the sick at the station as circumstances permit, and in an emergency if the fleet needs assistance at any time it can make periodical trips as required to relieve them of their sick. Such a position would have prevented the "Connecticut" from having to leave the drill grounds and go to the hospital at New York-during the past winter. Since January last it has been necessary to transfer 169 cases from the hospital at Norfolk at other naval hosnitals and there are 159 cases in the Norfolk hospital.
