Under the King free high school law enacted by the last legislature several thousand pupils in Nebraska are entitled to high school privileges outside their districts when the privileges are not furtion under the law is paid by the district n which they live. To take advantage of the provision for free tuition pupils must have their applications in the hands of the county superintendent by June 10, together with a certificate from the county superintendent relating to their pullifications to enter higher grades than

The examination of the present eighth grade pupits has almost been completed by Superintendent Yoder, and to those who have expressed a desire to continue their school work in another district he is sending application blanks. Under the law schools destring to receive credit for any high school work must meet the requirements of the Nebraska High school manual in the matter of teachers, apparatus, etc. State Superintendent McBrien, discussing this point in the Nebraska Teacher, says:

The county superintendent, in this capacity, becomes the county inspector of high schools for all high schools of the county which maintain less than the full four years high school course. Before signing a certificate for any such high school pupils, he will need to satisfy himself by inspection and such other means as he may desire on the following points:

(a) That the high school course of study includes the proper amount and kind of work for the grades completed.

(b) That efficient teachers, proper apparatus and other necessary equipment have been provided.

(c) I' at the work outlined in the course of study has been carried out, that the pupils has done efficient work in a manner which entities him to receive the county certificate.
