DES MOINES IN A FERMENT

City Stirred Up Over Election to Change Plan of Government.

FRAUD CHARGES BEING MADE

Congressman Hill Going Out Over His District Looking Over Political Fences—Primary Law Makes It Necessary.

(From a Staff Correspondent.) DES MOINES, June 19.—(Special.)—This city is in a state bordering on hysteria because of the election to take place Thursday on the question of the adoption of a commission form of government to change the executive-legislative-judicial form.

Every effort has been made by all interests to fight the question to a finish. The opponents of the plan have money gotten from some source with which they are fighting the idea. The proponents of the commission plan have plenty of money for the business interests of the city generally are for the plan and they have shelled out liberally.

An assessment of \$5 was made on each of the committee of \$0 which is conducting the campaign for the bill. This raised \$1,500 which, however, does not begin to pay the expenses. Business men, many of them, have given \$100 donations and many even larger amounts. No general or state election has excited greater interest in Des Moines than has this election.

Following the efforts of Alderman Hamery yesterday to prove that the city council was attempting to steal the election and defeat the plan by manipulation of the registration books there are complaints today that the city clerk has refused to deliver to the clerk and credit of William Struck in the sum of \$410 on account of a double assessment. The plaintiffs claim that Struck appeared before the town council while that body was sitting as a board of equalization and that his plea to have his assessment stricken from the books was turned down at that time.

They also claim that the twenty days provided by law for an appeal to the county board had elapsed. James Robinson of Magnolia sued Louis Praymuller, assessor, and G. W. Atkins, auditor, the grievance being that the assessor for Magnolia township assessed his real estate at \$7,000 and his personal property at \$104 and then added 100 per cent on account of Robinson's having refused to list said property with him as required by law.

ARGUMENTS IN KAUFMANN CASE

Probability Woman's Fate Will Be in Hands of Jury This Afternoon.

FLANDREAU, S. D., June 19.—(Special.)—The summing up arguments in the Kaufmann murder case had not been concluded this evening when court took an adjournment until 9 o'clock Wednesday morning.

George Rice of counsel for the defense followed State's Attorney Or of Minnahan county, and State's Attorney Blewitt of Moody county for the state had not concluded when court adjourned for the day and will complete his remarks tomorrow morning. It is understood he will be followed by Judge Frank Atkins for the defense and that George B. Egan will then make the closing argument for the state. It is thought it will be well toward evening tomorrow before the arguments are concluded, the charge of Judge Smith made to the jury and the case finally turned over to the jury for action by that body.

There is a possibility that the case may reach the jury at 8 or 4 o'clock Wednesday afternoon, but this now appears somewhat doubtful, but that it will be turned over to the jury by the close of the afternoon session is reasonably certain.

Throughout the afternoon session hundreds of people crowded their way into the court room for the purpose of listening to the arguments. Those making the summing up arguments are going over the testimony very thoroughly and are bitterly attacking the testimony of the principal witnesses. The state witnesses on each side represented by Peter Erickson for the state and Dr. W. A. Germain for the defense. George Rice for the defense, in his argument this afternoon, minutely pointed out the inconsistencies of Judge Smith's testimony as offered at the preliminary examination of Mrs. Kaufmann a year ago and as given by him at the trial of the case. Attorney Blewitt in his argument for the state somewhat bitterly assailed the testimony of Dr. Germain, the object of each side being to weaken, if possible, with the jury, the effect of the testimony given by the star witnesses on each side of this now famous case.

Extraordinary precautions are being taken with the jury. Under the instructions of Judge Smith they are not permitted to even discuss the case among themselves pending the turning of the case over to them for final adjustment. The strain has been a severe one on the jury, as the members have, since the commencement of the trial, virtually been protected so far as possible by the officers in charge of them, giving them exercise by walks about the town in a body, during which they are constantly under the eye and in charge of balliffs who do not permit anyone to even exchange the usual civilities with the jury-men.

AUTO ACCIDENT IN ST. PAUL

Fred Schroeder Killed by Fall from Machine Driven by J. J. Hill's Son.

ST. PAUL, Minn., June 19.—While riding in an automobile driven by Walter Hill, son of James H. Hill, Fred Schroeder, a heavy man, was killed this evening by falling out of the machine, the wheels of which ran over his head. It is thought Schroeder was attacked with apoplexy.
