Engagement of Gold for Holland Causes Early Pressure on Values.

MOVEMENT TO PARIS CHECKED

When This Becomes Known Organized Support Pushes Prices Upward—Profit-Taking Is Cause of Another Decline.

NEW YORK, July 3.—The fluctuations of speculative sentiment and of prices today were directed by the developments bearing on the money position especially the export gold movement. The stocks were under pressure at the outset on account of the unexpected engagement of \$1,000,000 in gold for export for Holland and the indication that the gold would be shipped to Paris to meet the demand for the gold.

The check to the Paris gold movement was the more readily explained by the news of operators embarking on speculation in stocks on margin to a threat of still greater depression of the money market.

An incident of the day was the transfer through the subtreasury of \$100,000 to New Orleans making the beginning of the southern demands for the moving of the cotton crop.
