

TWO YOUTHS KILL HAN PAK

Such is Statement of Willis Allmack on Arrest.

SAYS HE GETS PAY FOR WATCHING

Young Man Captured in St. Louis. Makes This Statement of Killing of Chinaman in Omaha.

ST. LOUIS, Mo., July 20.—(Special Telegram.)—Willis Allmack, a 17-year-old boy, arrested here today, says that two youths of his own age killed Tom Chung Yun of Omaha, nephew of Charley Chung, king of the St. Louis Chinamen, on the night of July 11. The boy said he did not know that the murder was to be committed, but that he witnessed the tragedy and accepted \$50 of the proceeds of the robbery that followed it. Allmack said he was employed in the restaurant operated by Yun over the Turtlaison in Omaha.

MURDER SUSPECT CAUGHT

Willis Allmack, alias Harry Rogers, the chief suspect in the Han Pak murder case, was captured Friday by the police of St. Louis, so local officials were notified Saturday. With his two companions, Joseph Humphrey and the other man, who also claimed the name of Rogers, Allmack left Omaha at 3 o'clock on the morning of Thursday, July 11. A few hours later the Chinaman was found in the kitchen of the Sing Hai restaurant, where he slept, frightfully beaten and very near death.

GAS TANK MEN ON STRIKE

Thirty They Are Not Getting Enough Money For Their Work.
