

CHAMPS WIN IN ELEVENTH

McLaughlin's Three-Bagger and Dolan's Error Decides Hard Game.

OMAHA LOSES THREE CHANCES

Howie Sluggers Fail to Connect with Ball at Critical Times, Though Several Opportunities Offer Themselves.

Des Moines, 1; Omaha, 0, 11 Innings. McLaughlin's three-bagger, following Dolan's error of the umpire's judgment in the eleventh inning, gave Des Moines the decision in the hardest fought pitchers' battle seen on the home ground this season, by the score of 1 to 0.

Ragan and Edmondson were the opposing slab artists, and for ten innings it was nip and tuck with neither having an advantage, but the tide turned in the eleventh inning and the game was lost through a hard luck combination. With two out in the eleventh, Edmondson hit a hard line grounder to Dolan, who juggled the ball for a second, but he recovered in time to throw to Ragan who covered the sack. The umpire called the runner safe, but few of the fans agreed with his judgment on the decision. That was what lost Omaha the game, for McLaughlin, the next Champ to face Ragan, hit a three-bagger, first between Bolden and Welch, and Edmondson trotted home, scoring the run which won the game.

Miller Saves the Game. Manager Kelley evidently thought the sprint from first had tired the young pitcher for he called upon Roscoe Miller, who he did the day before, to save the game. He did it, but he did his own work, doing the turn. Frank was the first of the Rourke family to face Roscoe in the eleventh and he hit for a single, the second hit of the game. The fans took heart, for some heavy hitters were coming along and they looked for a repetition of the game of the day before when Roscoe was handed his draw. Dolan tried to hit it out, but the ball went to Andrea, who subdued Frank at second by throwing to Gochnaur. The Frenchman was eager for a double and made his second wild throw to first, Dolan going to second, as it was just as good as a sacrifice. Austin hit the ball hard, but it went only as far as the shortstop and Dolan went to third on the play. That put it up to Grand Island Graham to save the game by driving Dolan in from third, but the best he could do was a fly to McLaughlin, and the game was lost.

Ragan was pitching great ball all the way through and but for the unfortunate error of Dolan the game might have gone on until dark. Three hits were made off his delivery, but one of them was a sacrifice. Gochnaur driving one at Ragan which was a little too hot for him to handle. The other two hits went in the same place, both just over Graham's head. Yeager's fly was fielded so it was but a single, but neither Bolden nor Welch could reach first, but McLaughlin's and it went for three sacks.

Edmondson was pitching just as good, although he passed five of the Rourke family, Graham, the first man up in the second inning, hit for a single to right, and Edmondson was the only one of the Rourke family to get a hit off Miller in the eleventh.

Omaha Loses Its Chance. Omaha had several chances to win the game, but the needed hit would not materialize. In the second, when Graham singled, he was sacrificed to second and neither Gochnaur, Welch nor Edmondson could drive him home. In the third, when Austin hit, he was walked, but was caught at first man when Austin tried to sacrifice. Austin got to second on Graham's infield out, but Autrey could not make good. In the tenth Edmondson passed Gochnaur, who was the first of the Rourke family to face him, but he was sacrificed to second, but Gochnaur was nailed at third on Ragan's grounder to the shortstop.

Unfortunately Highball was lame and had to be withdrawn. As a result Sonoma Girl won with ease, there being no other starters that could force her to her usual speed. Her best time was 2:05. Thornton was the only favorite to lose, Alice Pointer, second choice, winning her race in straight heats. Ed Geers, who drove the distance flag three times Tuesday, won the third race with Ardelle, the Memphis pacer that won the Chamber of Commerce stakes in 1906.

McDevitt, driver for David Shaw of Cleveland, scored his second victory of the season when he won the 2:30 trot with Highball. The track was in excellent condition for speed. There will be five races Thursday, the stake race for 3-year-old trotters being the feature.
