Prices Are Strong and Still on the Advance.

WHEAT HARVEST LATE IN NORTH Reports Are Cutting Cannot Be Finished Before September 25 and Years of Frost Are Anticipated.

OMAHA, Aug. 24, 1907. The grain market is in a strong position and prices are advancing. News from the northwest says farmers expect to finish wheat before September 25 and there is no question that a large percentage of the crop will be caught by frost.

Wheat opened strong and higher on firm cables, and continued bullish on news from the northwest wheat country. Buying was general and offerings very light. Wheat prices depend upon the news from the northwest at present. A general scramble for September wheat opened at 75c and closed at 80c.
