## BANKS MAKE NEW RECORD

Omaha Deposits Exceed Forty Mil-

lions of Dollars.

NEARLY FOUR PER CENT GAIN Call of the Comptroller Shows the Last Year Has Continued to

Increase ..... 8 486,620.97 Deposits in Omaha's national banks have reached a new high record. The five banks, at the call of the comptroller, reported for the close of business on August 22 deposits of \$40,512,489.21, which was 2.7 per cent, or \$1.467,298.60 higher than the previous high record of September 4, 1906.

"Doesn't look like the hard times they are talking about on Wall street, does it?" said a banker. 'The Wall street talk doesn't need to worry us out here in Nebraska, with good crops and plenty of money. We will move our wheat and oats and corn with our deposits and joan a little surplus to New York beside.

First National Heads. The First National bank has maintained its lead of the other banks all year in the matter of deposits. It and the Omaha National are always struggling for first place, and last September the Omaha National was ahead. The First National, since the sistement of a year ago, has gained the largest volume and the largest percentage of deposits.

All the banks are making money. In the last year, during which time dividends of \$ to 10 per cent have been paid, the surplus and undivided profits of the five banks show a gain of 16% per cent on a capitalization of \$2,800,000. In point of undivided profits, both in volume and percentage, the United States National has made the greatest gain in the last year.

Some of the banks have not increased their deposits since the statements of last May. This is accounted for by heavy withdrawals by the government of money it had on deposit in these banks. Government deposits in Omaha are light just now, but in spite of that the banks contain more money than ever before.
