

RAILROAD CASE MAY COME UP

Attorney Rich Changes His Mind About Mandamus Suit.

ATTORNEY GENERAL NOT READY

Argument Was Proffered at Request of Union Pacific and He Has Had No Time for Preparation.

(From a Staff Correspondent.)

LINCOLN, Sept. 15 (Special).—Whether a reargument will be made this week in the case where the railroad has asked for a mandamus from the supreme court to compel the State Board of Assessment to revalue and make a record of just how it arrived at the valuation of railroad properties has not yet been determined. Some days ago Edson Rich of the Union Pacific asked the attorney general to stipulate that the case go over until the next sitting of the court, as he was compelled to go to California to try an important case. The attorney general agreed, but Saturday Mr. Rich telephoned that possibly he would attend court here this week, and if he did he would be ready to try the case. This has given the attorney general practically no time to prepare for the hearing and he may ask that it go over. Supreme court will meet Tuesday, after having been adjourned all summer.

Waiting for Decision.

The attorney general is getting anxious for a decision from the federal court in the case where he argued that the railroad injunction suits be transferred back to the state courts. This argument was made three months ago, just before the judges went on their vacations, and it was expected a decision would be announced immediately after the argument, but it hasn't come down yet. This is the case where the attorney general filed an injunction suit against the railroad to prevent them from violating any of the legislation enacted by the state in the recent legislature. The corporation transferred the case to the federal courts.

Canvassing Board Meets.

The state canvassing board will meet next Tuesday to canvass the votes cast at the recent primary election. The result of this canvass will be nothing new, though in some instances figures may be slightly changed. The names of the nominees have already been announced.

Not a Candidate.

During the recent campaign between Judge Reese and Judge Sedgwick for supreme judge, W. D. Ross, chairman of the republican state committee, said he was not a candidate for reelection and would make no effort to secure the position again. If the place is offered to him, however, there is little doubt but what he will accept it. Mr. Ross is now in Pennsylvania visiting his mother. Several names have been mentioned here for state chairman, among them being Judge Hayward of Nebraska City and Ross Hammond of Fremont, but as the latter is devoting most of his time to land claimer Stephen's job it is not known whether he would have the time to do the work connected with the chairmanship. Among the democrats some still being made when they thought it is conceded if Tom Allen wants the job he will get it. On the other hand, he may not want it, as he has been lambasted so hard for his connection with railroads he may think a new hand at the helm might help out the party.

No State Accountant.

Nebraska is still worrying along without a state accountant because Auditor Searle has not yet named a man who is acceptable to Governor Sheldon. This law was enacted by the recent legislature after a hard fight. It being claimed there was crying demand for an accountant. At that time, it is said, the place was promised, but since the bill was passed Auditor Searle has not yet found the man he and the governor can get together on. The law provides the accountant must have the endorsement of the governor.
