Increase in Park Levy.

The Board of Park Commissioners has seen fit to increase the tax levy for 1907 for park purposes from 2 to 3 mills. The thirty-second general assembly enacted a law giving park boards the right of the size of Council Bluffs authority to levy a tax not exceeding 3 mills.
