We expect new crop Japan in the next week or ten days if weather favorable."

With reference to Holland herring the Strohmeyer & Arpe Co. say: "Shipments of late have ben quite large. Holland cables today that catch is poor now and that prices are rising. Quotation today show an advance of about 2½ cents per keg and 25 cents per barrel over last week's figures. One of their shippers of Norway mackerel cables that catch so far is very poor and abnormally high prices are being paid to the fishermen again this season. The fish as a rule runs small, so that large sizes of Norway mackerel are likely to be scarce. "The catch of oil sardines in France," the company says, "continues a fallure and the season being so far advanced there is no likelihood of many more being packed this season. French sardines are almost unobtainable. Portugal has had no small fish suitable for Dingley ½s for some time, and some of the best known brands have been out of the market for several months. Norway reports very poor catch of sardines and, of course, are unable to cope with the larged demand. Owing to the scarcity of French and Portuguese sardines there has been a largely increased demand for Norway smoke sardines. Prices for good and well known brands are held very firmly. The catch of spruts will not begin before the end of the year. Stocks here are very small and firmly held."

"Stock fish is being offered freely from Norway at such high prices that buyors are not inclined to place their orders."

Drugs and Chemicals. Opium is receiving small due. Prices have slightly advanced now, the basis being \$7.75 to \$7.80 as to quantity. Quinine is moving more rapidly. There is a firm understone, but the basis still remains at 16 cents for 100-ounce tins. The demand for Harlem eli continues good and prices are well maintained. Iron by hydrogen is firmer and prices have advanced about 10 per cent. There is activity in vanilla beans, no change in quotations, but indications of sharp advances. Elemental oils of every kind remain unchanged from our last report.
