ONE WAY TO ESCAPE JURY
Man Who Would Reverse Presumption of Law is Readily Rejected.
Because he said he would consider a colored man charged with the crime against women or burglary guilty until the was proven innocent, C. B. Denny, a member of the jury panel in district court, was excused from service on a jury in criminal court Tuesday by Judge Troup, who showed considerable feeling when he dismissed the juror. The case is one in which Francis Parker, a colored saloon porter, is charged with abusing 6-year-old Dora Hill, 206 North Twenty-first street. During his examination as a juror Mr. Denny said he could not give the defendant the benefit of a reasonable doubt.
"If you understood that it is the universal rule of law that the defendant is presumed to be innocent until he is proven guilty, could you not apply that rule in this case?" asked Judge Troup.
"In the case of a colored man charged with this crime, or with burglary, I would reverse the rule and consider him guilty until he is proven innocent," said Mr. Denny.
"That's a pretty hard proposition," said the court with some show of heat. "I guess you may stand aside. You wouldn't want judgment to reverse the rule in your case, would you?"
It is charged Parker enticed the little girl into a shed at Twenty-fifth and Parker streets and locked the door. The girl's screams attracted the attention of neighbors, who beat the door open. Parker, according to the neighbors, escaped and was captured after a long chase by some workmen.
The jury was completed just before noon. Owing to the persistence of many of the jurors the regular panel was exhausted and two takers had to be called in to complete the jury.
