"The Burlington railread will not do anything that will injure it in a business way," he said. "North Platte's freight shipments amount to \$49,000 a month. The Union Pacific is now spending \$500,000 increasing its facilities there so it can handle the business. If the Burlington made North Platte its division of course that road would get some of the business, maybe more than half, but if it attempts to build up a rival town naturally the people will stick to the Pnion Pacific and that road will get every bit of the business. It has been the policy of the Burlington, of course, not to build up a Union Pacific town, That road went through Grand Island and established a division point at Ravenna, but it hasn't injured Grand Island. So far as I know, the people at North Platts are not worried over the starting of Bignell."






