To Avoid Runs on Banks.

"During the forty years of the existence of national banks," said Senator Carter, "the loss to depositors has amounted to less than one-tenth of 1 per cent of the average deposits. It would seem, therefore, that if a tax of, say, one-quarter of

1 per cent of the average yearly deposits the comptroller of the currency to absonever become alarmed to a degree sufficient to induce him to start a 'run.' Con-

reduced.
