NEW TORK, Jan. 16 -Judge Hough of the United States circuit court, handed down today an epinion directing Otto H. Kuhn, a member of the banking firm of Kuhn, Loeb & Co., to answer all questions propounded to him by the Interstate Commerce commission. E. H. Harriman was directed to answer all questions except those relating to the purchase of Union

or Southern Pacific stock in connection with the dividend of August, 1906. While the exceptions were regarded as important questions by the government lawyers who were investigating the Chicago & Alton railroad reorganization, they constituted only a small proportion of those that Harriman refused to answer.

The clash between the witness and the commission occurred on February 25 of last year. For several days the investigators had been endeavoring to get at the bottom of Mr. Harriman's railway manipulations connected with the Chicago & Alton. tional church is destroyed by an The question that marked the beginning of the controversy was this:

"Did you own any of the Chicago & Alten preferred stock sold by the syndicate to the Union Pacific?"

Immediately the railroad president's lawyer, John G. Milburn, contended that the inquiry was not within the scope of the

Frank B. Kellogg, the government's attorney, took the contrary view. The outcome, after prolonged arguments, was that Harriman declined to answer a number of questions as to stock transactions, on the ground of personal privilege.

Guaranty Deposit Law and Amendment to Revenue Law, with Prohibition, Also Subjects for Action.

TOPEKA, Kan, Jan. 18-The fifth special session of the Kansas legislature convened this afternoon. Practically every member was present. The senate was called to order by Lieutenant Governor W. J. Fitzgerald, and the house of representatives by Speaker J. S. Simmons,

The senate and house resumed business just about where they left off at the close of the regular session last March. The bills of interest that are expected to be formulated into laws are the guaranty deposit law, the primary election bill, the amendment to the assessment and taxation law, the passage of a 2-cent fare law and amendments to the prohibitory law. It is expected the session will last ten days. The governor announces that the legislature is called to enact a primary election law, to strengthen the tax commission law, to establish a bank depositors' guarantee fund, to enact ratiroad legislation
