Led Jockeys for the Second Time Last Year.

STILL HOLDS WORLD'S RECORD

Walter Miller, as in 1906, was first among the riders on the flat in the number of winning mounts last season, says Chicago Racing Form, but he fell short of his great record of riding 338 winners in the previous year.

That he is a very successful rider is a matter of record, and that record carries with it the certainty that he excels in some of the qualities that go to make a high class jockey, but there are not a few who question his judgment of pace and deem him lacking in other particulars adherent to the truly great artist in the saddle.
