The Omaha Real Estate exchange passed resolutions and accepted a report of a special committee, declaring in favor of state guarantee of deposits in all banks chartered by the banking board and urged that it be brought about at once by a special session of the legislature called for that purpose, after thirty minutes of spirited debate Wednesday

formed the resolution, but did not call for s special session of the legislature, the William H. Green said he favored the

exchange going on record as demanding terms legislation which would absolutely guarantee the deposits in state banks, G. G. Waltare took the other side of the position, saying if state banks needed a ruarantee and the people were afraid of them, it was the best argument he knew of at present in favor of the postal savings banks. He made a motion to lay the resolutions on the table, where the postal savings bank endorsement rests in peace, and walt a year to see what will develop.

But Mr. Wallace lost his motion and D. C. Patterson spoke in favor of the resoutions, saying he did not want the exchange to wait to see what other states would do in enacting such laws, but wanted to be a leader in taking an action which he believed to be safe and sound.


