Says Street Railway Will Lay Tracks Pledged Last Summer.

NO EXTENSIVE WORK THIS YEAR

Fresh from the "enemy's" company, Gordon W. Wattles, president of the Omaha & Council Bluffs Street Railway company, returned to Omaha Thursday.

Mr. Wattles looks fine and will not enter upon the preparations for that tour of his around the world.

Mr. Wattles and Frank T. Hamilton, who beat him home a day, also met stockholders of the street railway in the east and with them talked over the matter of the proposed improvements with relation to the money market and the campaign year.

The Omaha & Council Bluffs Street Railway company expects to complete the extensions which it announced last summer would be built.
