### MOONSHINE, SAYS MORTON

Commander of Army Department Thus Dismisses Jingo Fake.

### DISTORTED REVIVAL OF OLD NEWS

Movement of Troops Was Ordered Last September and is Now Proceeding in Due Conformity to These Orders.

### "Moonshine."

This was the expression of Brigadier General Morton, commanding the Department of the Missouri, when he and a group of army officers read the drivel in the Evening Pinnacle about the movement of troops west.  
Succeeding in working itself into a frenzy over an alleged mobilization of troops at San Francisco for war purposes, the Pinnacle has failed to strike the serious side of life at Fifteenth and Dodge streets. Army officers have had several good laughs over the affair, but the excitement appears still to be confined to Seventeenth and Jackson streets.  
By consulting files of The Bee the Pinnacle could have discovered that this movement of troops is in compliance with general orders No. 130 of the War Department, issued September 15, 1907, and is the regular exchange of stations.  
Two batteries of the Fifth artillery will leave Fort Leavenworth February 15, and

### two other batteries of the same regiment leave Fort D. A. Russell, Wyo., for the Pacific coast some time in June. These batteries simply go to the Philippines to relieve similar batteries that have been in the islands two years, and these batteries will return and occupy the stations vacated by the Fifth artillery. The Fourth infantry will leave for the same destination to relieve the Eighth infantry on March 5.

### First Sailed in December.

The first cavalry sailed from San Francisco December 5 for Manila, reaching there January, and relieved the Third cavalry, which will reach the United States early in February. The two remaining troops of the First cavalry will depart for the Philippines upon the arrival of the Third cavalry, taking station in Texas at posts formerly garrisoned by the First cavalry.

### The Fifth artillery batteries, under orders to proceed to the Philippines, will not take their guns or horses, but will leave them at Fort Leavenworth and D. A. Russell for the equipment of the returning batteries of artillery which the Fifth artillery will relieve in the Philippines. The batteries of artillery to be relieved by the Fifth artillery will leave their horses and guns in the Philippines for the equipment of the Fifth artillery. It is simply a case of exchange of stations of men, but not of equipment. The same rule will apply in the case of the First cavalry, which relieves the Third cavalry, in the matter of horses and other heavy equipment.

### The Eighth infantry will occupy the posts of Fort Mackenzie, Wyo., and Fort Thomas, Ky., that will be vacated by the Fourth infantry.

The Fourteenth infantry left for the Philippines January 5, to relieve the Twenty-fourth infantry; the Twenty-third infantry will leave San Francisco February 5 for the Philippines, and the Seventh infantry will leave San Francisco April 5 to relieve the First infantry, now in the Philippines.

### GOLD BRICKS WERE PAID FOR

Pacific Express Settled for \$11,000 for Metal Stolen from Sidney Depot.

Records of the Pacific Express company show that \$11,000 was paid to the shippers of the gold bricks taken from the Pacific Express company March 10, 1889, and supposed to be the bricks found under the Tobin saloon at Sidney a few days ago. Nothing has been heard as to the value of the bricks sent to St. Louis by Superintendent George Patterson to ascertain their value. It is probable that the express company will forward them to New York City, before a final value is placed on the gold which they contain.

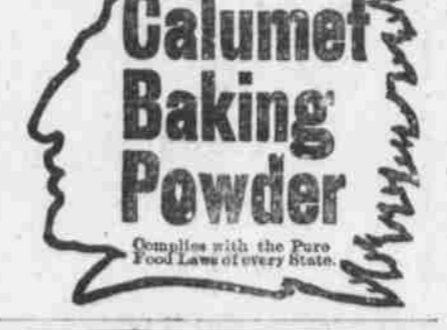
Old express officials are of the opinion that the bricks consigned to St. Louis by Mr. Patterson are the missing bricks from the depot robbery, the loot being so large that it is not unlikely the robbers left the bricks under the depot and did not attempt to dispose of them, or may have been deposited there by a robber who paid the penalty of his crimes by swinging at the end of a vigilantes' rope.
