DANIEL IS HARD TO MOVE *************

Gets Evidence Handed to Him and Calmly Says He "May Act."

CONDUCT ASTOUNDS THE POLICE

Unable to Account for City Pro cutor Sitting By and Deliberately Passing Up Knowledge of Offense.

Though twenty men appeared in the of-fice of City Prosecutor Daniel Thursday afternoon and accused W. Wells Abbott, president of the Guarantee Reference and Surety company, of defrauding them of \$3 each and though Abbott admitted that he had been conducting a fradulent business, he was allowed to go after promising to pay back to those who appeared the \$2 which he had received from them.

The city prosecutor merely said he would" file a charge against Abbott for doing business without a license. It was pointed out that Abbott had admitted geting money under false pretenses and that here were at least twenty men ready to appear as complaining witnesses on this more serious charge. The city prosecutor said he would "see" later and "maybe" would file this charge.

Abbott's concern does business with an imposing looking letter head which states the fact it is a "Brain Hunter." The office is on the sixth floor of the Brandeis build-

It is said that more than 100 men applied for positions and paid the \$2 fee last week with this agency. Some of those who appeared before the city prosecutor said they had been waiting three weeks for a job. A sample letter in the hands of the city resecutor reads:

This will introduce you to Mr. DeLay." Most of Them Had Such Letter. Most of the applicants carried this letter of intoduction to C. A. Burns, illis Farnam street. They were told he had a large factory on South Twentieth street and was a heavy employer of labor. Mr. Burns, incidentally, is secretary and treasurer of the Guarantee Reference and Surety company, Other letters of introduction were to the Ridgley Merchandise company and to the Jewel Tea company, though these concerns say they never sought to get men through the agency.

Abbott said he had bought the business of the employment agency only last December. He left the office of the city prosecutor, accompanied by the men, and later in the afternoon he handed each the \$2 in cash which he had received.

The nonchalant way in which Daniel has treated this case of open-handed graft, in view of his unbounded zeal in playing the role of detective in recent cases where the man Martin, against whom, it is said, certain officials have some special grudge, was concerned, has simply astounded police authorities. They are unable to account for the course of a city prosecutor, who, when undisputed evidence of a serious offense is handed to him without an effort on his part, indifferently turns and says, "I may file a complaint against these men." STRAWBERRIES ARE NO MORE only Few Special Orders In and They Are Sixty to Eighty Cents a Quart.

After the plentiful supply of last week, except for a few crates, the local market was destitute of strawberries Friday mornng. The few boxes in were special orders and sold from 60 to 80 cents a ouert. The recent rains will have a tendency to advance the price of oranges a little, but the price may not keep up long for March always brings heavy shipments from Callfornia and the price drops accordingly. At present oranges are selling from 15 to 25 cents a dozen. It is estimated that the fruit dealers of Omaha will lose from \$1,500 to \$2,000 this week on bananas as a result of the cold snap. An unexpected carload of sweet potatoes from Kansas came in this week and they are selling about 5 or 6 cents a pound. potatoes are selling from 75 cents to \$1 a bushel. Tomatoes are scarce and of poor quality just now. t being between the Cuban and Florida seasons. They are selling for 55 cents a five-pound basket. All the green stuff is plentiful as usual and there is little

Fine young "brollers" are in market now and they wholesale for \$5 a dozon. They will weigh about two pounds each. "Springs," chickens, are selling wholesale for 12 and 12% cents a pound; ducks for 13 cents; goese for 11 cents and turkeys for 18 cents. Guinea hens are the nearest approach to game in market now and sell for
