CHICAGO GAME GOES NORTH

Badger Foot Ball Men Happy Over Selection of Place. TWO CONTESTS IN EIGHT DAYS.

Before Maroons—Prospects for Base Ball Team Are Fairly Good. MADISON, Wis., Feb. 23.—(Special.) Athletics at Wisconsin have again come into their own after two weeks' rest during examination week. The men who will represent the Badgers have faced games with little being expected of them and the outlook is now bright for a prosperous year.

The bringing of the Chicago game to Wisconsin is the one topic of conversation among the students, there is great rejoicing as a result. Last year, when the possibility of the Chicago game was discussed, it was generally believed that the team would be plucked on Marshall field, so that the announcement came as quite a surprise. Wisconsin will meet Minnesota at Minneapolis on November 7, the Chicago game following a week later. Some criticism was heard in regard to the arranging of two games within eight days, but it was the only thing that could be done under the circumstances, and will hit around equally hard as the other two teams met within the same period.

It is not likely that more than one other college game will be scheduled with the Badgers. The only other college game which is now under way for a game with Coach Catlin's eleven at Iowa, but nothing has been definitely settled. Marquette college at Milwaukee will be given a week at the Badgers, although the thing is still hanging in the air. The students here are hoping that a game can be arranged with the Catholic institution for they are tired of the taunts of equality that emanate from Milwaukee. Wisconsin could not hope to gain any prestige from the game, for it is homely accepted that Marquette does not make any pretense of adhering to the eligibility rule.
