HARD PROBLEM IN CITY FINANCE

Revenue Not Up to Present Requirements of the City, How to make \$100,000 do the work of \$150,000 or \$160,000 is the problem which is now confronting the finance committee of the city council, The committee has started work on the appropriation ordinance, upon which the present council must take action before faring over the management of the affairs of the municipality to the new council at the beginning of April, For the fiscal year which closes March 31, there was appropriated a total of \$1,740,700 for the maintenance of the several municipal departments, The levy of 10 mills for the general fund, out of which the several city departments are maintained, is the limit allowed by law, On the present valuation this brings in approximately \$2,000,000, and the balance has to be made up on the sale of licenses, which in the past have brought in about \$200,000, any from license, police fines, forfeitures and other items of a more or less uncertain and unstable character, With the loss of the revenue from the gambling houses and the probability of a less number of saloons during the coming year, the strict enforcement of the saloon law, the finance committee is confronted with the necessity of materially reducing the total amount of the annual appropriations and at the same time provide for the maintenance of the various departments of the municipal government, The council has already reduced the police fines, forfeitures, etc., up to and including the month of January averaged about \$1,500 a month, but in February it dropped to \$200, and in March to \$250, With conditions as they are now the turnover from the public to the city will not, it is expected, be for many months in excess of the \$1,000,000, The amounts turned over by the police department to the city treasury for the last fiscal year, by months, were as follows: April, 1907, \$1,475,000; May, 1907, \$1,475,000; June, 1907, \$1,475,000; July, 1907, \$1,475,000; August, 1907, \$1,475,000; September, 1907, \$1,475,000; October, 1907, \$1,475,000; November, 1907, \$1,475,000; December, 1907, \$1,475,000; January, 1908, \$1,475,000; February, 1908, \$1,475,000; March, 1908, \$1,475,000, The amounts appropriated for the several departments for the fiscal year now commencing are as follows: Police, \$1,740,700; Fire department, \$1,740,700; Public works, \$1,740,700; City electrician, \$1,740,700; City hall, \$1,740,700; Printing and supplies, \$1,740,700; Health department, \$1,740,700; Public works, \$1,740,700; Health department, \$1,740,700, Councilman Fleming, chairman of the finance committee, stated yesterday that in view of the reduced revenue, the appropriations would have to be cut down for the ensuing year to about \$2,000, but where to make the cut was what was puzzling the committee, It is believed there will be a balance of about \$1,000 left over for the general fund at the close of this year, and the city council will have to make up the difference, That some reductions in the police department will have to be made appears certain, and it is likely that one or two men will be dropped from each force, The appropriation ordinance has to be ready to be submitted at a meeting of the council to be held Thursday evening, March 12, N.
