Wheat continues to work higher, supported strongly by bull leaders. While crop reports slightly and only have few showing tendency to advance and only checked by selling on all bulks. Very heavy, long holders, who have turned in Nebraska and Kansas the crop experts are beginning to turn their attention to the northwest and the wheat market is beginning to show signs of being affected. Wheat was slightly affected by the selling which was induced by very favorable crop advices following the opening of the market and clearing of the wheat market and better support from the bulk factors, which held steady, closing at 94c.
