BULLS FORCE WHEAT PRICES UP

Government Reports of Decrease Caused Wheat to Be Boosted to Top Notch—Corn Steady and Oats Higher.

OMAHA, May 8, 1908.

Market values had a strong opening this morning, but eased off with lack of trade towards noon caused by speculative traders waiting for the government monthly report.

Wheat took a decided upturn on an increased demand owing to the bullish feeling induced by the government decrease.

Clearances were 1,800 bushels of corn, 2,725 bushels of oats, and wheat and flour equal to 12,227 bushels.

Primary wheat receipts were 62,000 bushels and shipments were 25,000 bushels.
