

GRAIN AND PRODUCE MARKET

Disputed Condition of Growing Crops Govern Exchange Conditions.

RAINS HOLD BACK SHIPMENTS

Firm Liverpool Cables and Reported Damage by Storm Force Values Up at Close of the Market.

Grain markets are held entirely by the position taken by large holders of cash grain. Deferred futures remain steady.

Wheat options opened weak on general selling and continued bearish sentiment by the crowd.

Corn opened sensationally strong and held firm throughout the session on heavy demand and numerous storm damage reports.

Local receipts for wheat and flour are reported to be 100,000 bushels against receipts last year of 80,000 bushels.

Clearances were 9,000 bushels of corn, 13,000 bushels of oats and wheat and flour to 75,000 bushels.

Liverpool closed 1/4 higher on wheat and unchanged on corn.

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NEW YORK STOCKS AND BONDS

Market is Strong All Day and Prices Are Generally Higher.

HARRIMAN ISSUES IN LEAD

Rumor That Support is Due Largely to Foster Demand for New Capital Issues—Hills and St. Paul Also Up.

NEW YORK, May 13.—While the strength in today's market for stocks was manifest, there was no mistaking its principal character and the speculation showed an animation and considerable variety.

The purpose to foster the demand for new capital issues was believed to prompt the movement for supporting the hills and the Harriman Pacific are credited with largest interest at present.
