CHICAGO, May 21.—Damage to the fall wheat crop estimated today in the local wheat market.

The wheat market was firm all day, chiefly because of crop damage reports.

Advices received stated that a large part of the crop in southern Indiana and Ohio.

NEW YORK, May 21.—The movement of prices in the stock market today was erratic to a high degree.

Steel was almost immovable most of the day and took no share of the fluctuations in other quarters.
