

CLUBS TO SHOW PRIZE CORN

Three Thousand Grain Dealers Organize Groups of Five.

CORN SHOW DAY AT BELLEVUE

Prof. F. G. Holden Will Address Chautauque Assembly July 31 and Whole Day Will Be Given to Agricultural Subjects.

No fewer than 2,000 grain dealers in the west will organize corn clubs of five members each, which will compete for the \$400 corn sheller and \$500 gang plow to be given as premiums at the National Corn exposition.

Arrangements for this contest were completed Tuesday and the announcement made by Prof. J. Wilkes Jones, manager of the exposition.

The grain dealer is to be one of the five in each neighborhood and he may buy the corn he exhibits, but the other four members of such clubs must raise the corn they show.

It is the idea of the management of the National Corn exposition to interest as many as possible in producing the best corn.

In many neighborhoods there are but one or two growers. By making it necessary for five to exhibit, those who are already producing prize corn will be compelled to interest others in order to secure one of the valuable premiums.

Space will be reserved for the implement and farm machinery manufacturers and dealers to give good demonstrations of their machinery. This was not decided until Tuesday when \$150 square feet were set aside for the implement men.

This means that the farmer may learn at the National Corn exposition how to handle most any gas engine made and it is believed more farmers would use gasoline engine power if they were not uncertain as to whether they could handle the engine or not.

The latest alfalfa cutting machinery, will also be shown and the growers who are having difficulty cutting the first crop will have an opportunity to see the latest machinery in motion.

Day at Bellevue. July 31 has been made "corn show day" at the Bellevue Chautauque and Prof. F. G. Holden will deliver two addresses on that day, in the afternoon on the subject of agriculture in general, and in the evening on "Agriculture and Its Relation to Public Schools."

War has been declared on the various corn pests and large charts are being prepared for use in connection with the addresses given during the summer and also at the National exposition in December.

The corn root worm, which costs the farmer from five to fifteen bushels to each acre of corn, will be shown up and ways devised to exterminate the pest. The bill bug and corn louse will both receive some attention.

In completing the premium list for the Juniors it has been possible to give the Juniors an opportunity to compete for scholarships, bicycles, rifles and one pony, cart and harness will be offered.

In some of the other departments organs and pianos will be given as premiums.

The premium list is growing daily, and it is now certain that more than \$20,000 will be distributed to the best growers of corn and grains.

SUIT FOR LOST AFFECTION

First Case Scheduled for Trial Before Judge T. C. Munger in Federal Court.

No cases being ready for trial in the federal courts before Wednesday, Judge T. C. Munger Monday evening accused the jury until Wednesday morning and left for Lincoln. He will return in time for the opening of court Wednesday.

The first case scheduled for trial is that of Clarence E. Campbell against Nellie V. Peck for damages in alienating his wife's affections. The plaintiff in the brother-in-law of the defendant and he charges her with persuading his wife to leave him and that his wife now refuses to live with him.

SAVIDGE GETS THOMAS HOME

Secures Old Dwelling for Dependent Aged People of Omaha. NEW PROPOSITION FOR HIM First Christian Church Man Proposes to Put Savidge at the Head of Benevolent Society in Nebraska.

Rev. Charles W. Savidge has signed a contract for the old Dexter L. Thomas home at 926 North Twenty-seventh avenue and will convert it into a home for aged people. The price to be paid is \$5,000 and Mr. Savidge hopes to be able to raise that amount to provide a suitable and permanent home for the dependent aged of Omaha.

The contract calls for the payment of \$1,500 by July 1, when Mr. Savidge will take possession, and the balance to be paid for the rate of \$1,200 a year until the entire amount is raised. Plans are now being formulated for raising the money. City Treasurer Frank Purdy told Mr. Savidge that he would be one of 150 men to pay \$5 apiece toward raising the entire amount.

The house is suitable for the work which Mr. Savidge is doing, as it is large, with spacious and light rooms, two of the rooms being twenty-four feet long. The house contains seventeen rooms and was first built by Mr. Thomas in 1876 and in 1892 was rebuilt at an expenditure of \$18,000. Five years ago the house was disposed of by Mr. Thomas and was used for a time by the Swedish Hospital association. Later \$1,500 was expended in repairs on the house, which is finished throughout in hard wood and is three stories high. Mr. Savidge thinks he has struck a bargain to get such a place for his work at an expenditure of \$5,000.

In a Quandary Now. An interesting situation confronts Mr. Savidge in his work and he must decide whether to go ahead and work independently as he has done, or to take the house as a gift and still remain at the head.

When Mr. Savidge told one of the prominent attorneys of Omaha and a member of the First Christian church of his desire to buy the Thomas house, the attorney immediately made a proposition to Mr. Savidge which set him to thinking. In the Christian church is conducted a National Benevolent association, although there has been no branch in Omaha.

"I will give you that house free of debt within two hours if you will take it from the benevolent society of our church and become the head of that society in Nebraska," said the attorney. Mr. Savidge is still debating what to do.

"I have always worked independently and alone and think I have been able to accomplish a lot of good. I am sure the good people of Omaha will stand back of me and assist me to raise money to buy that splendid home for the old people," said Mr. Savidge.

Mr. Savidge plans to form a benevolent association with a board of directors and officers to manage the affairs of the home and to control the work.
