been offered in Omaha at ridiculously low prices, ranging from 65 to 85 cents on the dollar. These low prices were made because stolen property may be sold at any price and still show a nice profit. This week \$25,000 of these bonds appeared

in Kansas City and Omaha parties made an offer for them, not knowing that the title was not good. The Kansas City people were instructed to ship the bonds to Omaha in care of the First National bank. This was done, but prior to their arrival suspicion had been aroused to such an extent that a telegram was sent to Mr. Grant and he in turn notified his attorney to replevin them if they turned out to ba his. When the bonds arrived at the bank the sheriff at once levied on them and took them into his possession. The bonds are now in safe keeping and will be held until the termination of the suit. The First National bank has not been

sued for any damages, as was stated in the papers, and had no knowledge that the bonds were even shipped to them until they arrived. They have acted only in the best of faith throughout the whole transaction. Of the \$40,000 that was stolen there is \$15,000 still unaccounted for and we wish to advise the public to use great care in purchasing our bonds from unknown parties, unless they can show an absolutely clear title, as Mr. Grant will replevin his wherever found


