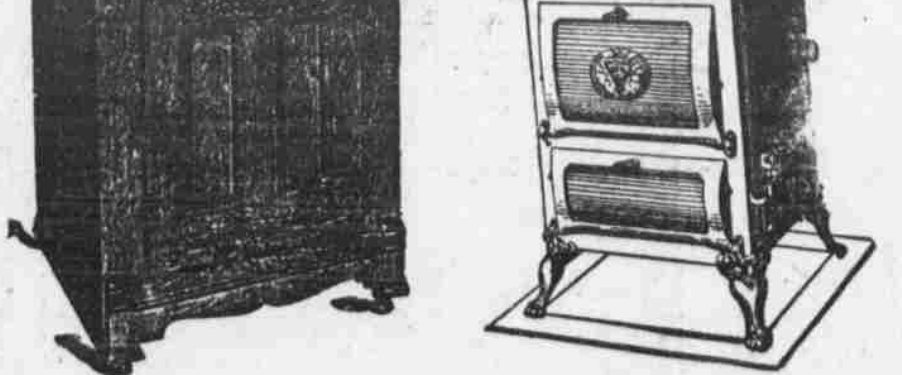

**NEW OIL GUSHER IN WYOMING**  
Well Near Byron Not Yet Under Control Produces Five Hundred Barrels Daily.

Wyoming is again agitated over the discovery of a new oil well which promises to furnish a large supply of illuminating oil of the highest grade. In borings for oil and a quarter mile west of Byron a gusher was struck last week which is pouring out 200 barrels a day and it is not yet completely under control. Other smaller wells have been struck in that vicinity so that the total output near Byron is now about 600 barrels a day. It is the plan of the Wyoming & Montana Oil company to build a pipe line to Cowley and there build a refinery. Reports have been received on the oil and it is said to be of the finest quality of illuminating oil.
