

GRAIN AND PRODUCE MARKET

Local Market is Dull and Opening Values Were Unchanged.

WEAK CABLES GOVERN MARKET

Some Decided Improvement in Crop Prospects Was Also Largely Due to Sag in Local Market Values.

OMAHA, June 23, 1908. Dullness characterized the early market and the opening values were unchanged to slightly lower. Offerings were larger and support from the outside was feeble, prompted by weaker cables. There was a short reaction after the start and values advanced slightly, but again the advance was not on selling to realize.

After a dull and featureless wheat market, which lasted throughout the early part of the session, prices sagged off, principally on account of the improvement in crop prospects and more bearish advice. July wheat opened at 82c and closed at 82c.

Corn was steady at the start and opening values were unchanged. Later an easier feeling developed in sympathy with wheat and fear offerings of values lost under pressure of selling. July corn opened at 65c and closed at 65c.

Primary wheat receipts were 304,000 bushels and shipments were 30,000 bushels. Against receipts 100,000 bushels and shipments 20,000 bushels. Corn receipts were 75,000 bushels and shipments 10,000 bushels. Against receipts 1,116,000 bushels and shipments 72,000 bushels. Cereals were 1,000 bushels of oats and wheat and flour equal to 20,000 bushels. Liverpool closed bid lower to 4d higher on wheat, and 1d lower on corn.

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WEATHER IN THE GRAIN BELT

Heavy rains were quite general throughout Nebraska last night and showers were general over the central valleys and mountain districts. The barometer is low and the upper valleys this morning and rains continue in the upper Mississippi valley. An area of higher pressure in the mountain districts and the weather has cleared generally west of the Missouri river and considerable rain is falling in this vicinity tonight and Wednesday, with cooler tonight.
