POLICE LOOK FOR W. C. COOPER
Would Very Much Like to Lay Hands on the Pseudo Labor Agent.

W. C. Cooper, pseudo labor agent, residence anywhere, occupation anything, is being sought for by the police for swindling laborers out of various sums of money ranging from \$5 to \$10. Cooper, however, has started for the west, "to avoid temporary trouble," as he explained in a letter written to the "captain of police."

Numerous complaints were received by the police and Judge Crawford Wednesday and Thursday from the victims who had given money to Cooper, receiving his receipt for the same, for transportation to towns, where Cooper alleged to have secured positions for them.

In a letter written to the "captain of police" from South Omaha, Cooper explained that John Priest, a local liverman, had financed the company known as the Overland Labor agency, 23 South Twelfth street, to which business Cooper had devoted his entire time and services. The receipts of the firm were to be divided equally. Business was poor from the start, and to compensate himself, Cooper negotiated with several men seeking jobs, received their money for transportation, and then "packed his tent and silently stole away." Cooper contends in his letter that Priest should be made to settle with the victims, but the latter takes a contrary view of the matter.
