LOUP POWER PLAN AGAIN Question Calls for Appointment of Committee by Commercial Club.

Once more Omaha business men are to take up the Loup river power proposition and ascertain the practicability of promoting the enterprise which has agitated engineers, promoters, capitalists, city councils and commercial organizations for a number of years.

"In appointing this committee the executive committee of the club does not wish to imply that the present price of power in Omaha is too high," said J. M. Guild, commissioner of the Commercial club.

TRIO OF BANKRUPTCY CASES Omaha Man Files Voluntary Petition and Local Firms Are Creditors of Others.
