Statesman Frank Currie Makes the Trip on a Donkey to See the Big City.

"I hadn't seen the sights of Omaha for so long," said Mr. Currie, "that I took the first means of coming that I could."
When Mr. Currie was in Omaha the last time he thought he had made up his mind to run for the state senate this fall on the republican ticket. Now he is undecided.
