

GRAIN AND PRODUCE MARKET

Increased Receipts and Fair Offerings Weaken Values.

EXPORT CALL FOR WHEAT BETTER

Receipts are Gaining Daily, but Stocks are Well Run Out and Arrivals are Being Readily Absorbed.

With very little OMAHA, July 21, 1908. Values are somewhat weak in the situation to increased receipts and some freer offerings.

Wheat was easy from the start and worked lower during the day.

Corn opened steady but weak on larger receipts and a lower cash market.

Primary wheat receipts were 1,211,000 bushels and shipments were 469,000 bushels.

Corn receipts were 447,000 bushels and shipments were 417,000 bushels.

Clearances were 450,000 bushels of corn, one of oats and wheat and flour equal to 92,000.

Seaboard reported 744,000 bushels of wheat taken for export.
