

# State Chairman Hayward Republican Policies

## What the Party Has Accomplished in the Past and What It Promises for the Future

Chairman William Hayward of the Nebraska republican state committee, addressing the Lincoln Veterans' Republican club at Lincoln on Thursday, July 30, said: "I am glad of an opportunity to thank the Union Veterans' Republican club for their loyalty to the principles, candidates and campaign workers of the republican party. It has not been as severe a test of your loyalty as was the contest for human liberty in the great rebellion, but has been prompted by the same ideas and instincts of bravery and devotion which led you down the Shenandoah Valley, or from Atlanta to the sea. It has required firm conviction and honest adherence to principles on the part of your organization, for you are located in the home city of William J. Bryan, the candidate of the democratic party for president.

You have, however, a very good precedent for your past and future republican enthusiasm, in spite of this fact. In the year 1860 Mr. Bryan was the candidate of the same party for the same position, but now against us, and William McKinley of Canton, O., was the republican candidate.

On Friday, August 8, of that year, at 2 o'clock, Candidate Bryan left this city on the Rock Island for his famous campaign tour 'from Nebraska to the sea,' in which he carried the fight into the enemy's country. Without losing any time, he sped on to the town of Canton, O., where on Monday, August 1, he outlined the ethics of campaigning among the neighbors of a political opponent, which may well serve the republicans in their conduct during the present campaign.

**Invaded 'Enemy's Country.'**

I read from Candidate Bryan's book, 'The First Battle,' at page 36, being his address to McKinley's neighbors:

"Mr. Chairman, Ladies and Gentlemen: When I received notice a short time ago of the organization of a club in this city, I little imagined the tremendous sentiment which seems to be behind the club. I am glad to meet the people of this city, the home of my distinguished opponent, and am glad in their presence to testify to his high character and great personal worth. I shall be satisfied as an individual to be able to stand beside him in public esteem. But, my friends, this is not a contest between individuals. It matters little to the American people whether your distinguished townsman or myself occupies the chief executive position in this, the greatest nation upon earth, but does matter a great deal for what policies the president shall stand. In this campaign the personality of the candidates is lost sight of entirely in the principles for which the candidates stand. In my own state and in my own city there are many people who believe that the interests of the country will be better served by the election of my opponent, and I am gratified to know that in his home there are so many who believe that the interests of the country will be best served by his defeat. He is your neighbor, as we ordinarily use the word, but I beg you to turn to the scriptures and there read the parable of the neighbor for which I may not be your neighbor, geographically speaking, I may be your neighbor in the sense in which the word is used in the parable. In this contest I hope to be the neighbor to those who have fallen among thieves. He is a neighbor who, in the hour of distress, brings relief. At this time, when we are cursed by an European financial policy which our opponents tell us we must endure until relief comes to us from abroad, I believe that that man is the neighbor of all the tolling masses who asks for the immediate restoration of the free and unlimited coinage of gold and silver at the present legal ratio of 16 to 1, without waiting for the aid or consent of any other nation. I tell my neighbors at home that I shall bear them no ill will if they believe that my opponent should be elected, and I have so high an opinion of my opponent that I know he will say to his townsman here that every one should be free to make his ballot represent a freeman's will, although it may result in keeping your distinguished citizen among you as a neighbor still."

hold and bearships of the republican candidate and his official representative, speaks with apparent enthusiasm and personal satisfaction of his visit to Cleveland. I read again from Mr. Bryan's book, 'The First Battle,' on page 39:

"Arriving in Cleveland about 6 o'clock, we were escorted to the hotel by an impromptu procession, which seemed determined to show that in his efforts to elect a republican president, the chairman of the republican national committee did not have the unanimous support of his neighbors."

These are Candidate Bryan's words from his own tongue and pen and the story of his own actions which speak louder than words. To take them at their full value and intent they show as a Lincoln Republican along the path of the republican who holds his party allegiance as a matter of adherence to principles and time-tried and proven policies. To quote Candidate Bryan at Canton, "This is not a contest between individuals. \* \* \* It does matter a great deal for what policies the president shall stand. \* \* \* I am gratified to know that in his home there are so many who believe that the interests of the country will be saved by his defeat. \* \* \* I hope to be the neighbor of those who have fallen among thieves."

Thus speaks Candidate Bryan in 1860 to the neighbors of William McKinley in Canton, O. He was not with us in 1860. In the Nebraska republican to elect his neighbor (7), Candidate Bryan, is this a contest between individuals? In 1860 or is it a contest of principles? Does the Nebraska republican believe that in 1860 William McKinley's neighbors had fallen among thieves?

**Decided by Bryan.**

Candidate Bryan proclaimed the ethics of "neighborly" support of party candidates in 1898 and has written it in historical record. Accepting his conclusions as fair, correct and courteous to his opponent, the question before the Nebraska republican is: Who is your neighbor—William J. Bryan or William H. Taft?

Candidate Bryan having decided for us that we are privileged to campaign in Lincoln, as he did in Canton, I would like to discuss for a moment the inconsistencies of Candidate Bryan and his party, with reference to great republican leaders. It is unnecessary to remind a club composed of "Lincoln's hirelings" of the bitter abuse, vilification and anathemas which were hurled at Abraham Lincoln, the great liberator, by the democrats of Candidate Bryan and his party, when Candidate Bryan could find only bitter things to say of Theodore Roosevelt, the democratic spellbinder went across the land, and in referring to some things that they claimed Roosevelt had done, would say, "McKinley would not have done that." And so it had ever been with the great men of the republican party. It remained, however, for Theodore Roosevelt to attain the doubtful honor of having Candidate Bryan praise him during his lifetime.

In 1904, before, however, President Roosevelt had announced that he would not again be a candidate for the presidency, Candidate Bryan could find no good words to say of him. At Springfield, Mo., September 3, 1904, he said: "The surrender of the present president (Theodore Roosevelt) to corporate influences furnishes an excellent proof of the wisdom of Judge Parker in making the statement he has." Think of it! Bryan accuses Roosevelt of surrendering to corporate influences.

**Abuse of Roosevelt.**

Further on in this tirade of abuse against Roosevelt, in which he is accused of holding "bloody, brutal and barbarous sentiments," Candidate Bryan solemnly declared that President Roosevelt stood for military rule and said: "The republicans are increasing the army and navy and relying on a riot of cartridges." It is a significant fact, touching the question of his insincerity of purpose, that in no case has he given praise to any popular man, whether of his own or another party, who still remained a presidential possibility. Lincoln was dead when Bryan praised him; McKinley was dead when the democratic orators held him

up as a model for Roosevelt to follow; President Roosevelt had, by his statement on election night, eliminated himself from the presidential race, before Bryan found it in his heart to give him any praise. In his own party, Grover Cleveland remained a strong, virile character and a presidential possibility, and we find Candidate Bryan shouting from a platform in Urbana, O., four years ago, in reference to Grover Cleveland: "The democrats in 1892 played a confidence game on the public and put a bunco stealer at the head of the party." All of those things must, I say, determine the question of whether Candidate Bryan has been sincere and straightforward, or whether he has been a politician, whose conscience has been tempered and colored, chameleon-like, by considerations of opportunity.

**Out of the Race Once.**

One more little illustration: On November 7, 1890, just after Mr. Bryan's defeat the second time by McKinley, the World's Work states that he sent the following telegram to J. F. Merrill of Kansas City: "Thank you for your telegram of condolence. The defeat was a severe one; you all did nobly. I cannot conscientiously ask the party to consider me again for the presidency. I led the party to defeat four years ago and that ought to be enough for any man."

Who is his present candidacy in view of this telegram with the calm, deliberate and self-sacrificing manner in which President Roosevelt yielded not to temptation but kept his faith and his word. But whether deliberately insincere and yet never right, on the one hand, or sincere and always wrong on the other hand, is not for me to decide. The democratic candidate has ever seemed to follow the scriptural adage: "Let not your right hand know what your left hand doeth." With one hand, especially in republican centers, he paints the virtues of President Roosevelt in the brightest colors; with the other, through the medium of Chairman Clayton of the democratic national convention, whose speech Mr. Bryan is said to have read and approved before its delivery, the president is assaulted personally and his personal honor assailed. Chairman Clayton, referring to the 1904 campaign, says: "Is it true or not that four years ago he (Theodore Roosevelt) selected for his campaign manager a novice in politics, whose political qualifications were so poor that he could not be trusted to handle the corporations of the land? Is it true or not that the official page as secretary of commerce and labor gave full knowledge of these business secrets and relations of corporations to this campaign manager, and clothed him with power, with the assent of the president, to punish or reward them, publishing or withholding their secret that he had collected as such secretary?"

Chairman Clayton then proceeds to continue his accusation that President Roosevelt is a blackmailer and purchased his election in 1904 by the use of money which he had wrung from the corporations by dishonest methods.

**Another Condemnation.**

The Denver platform of which Candidate Bryan was the conceded author, makes another cowardly attack upon President Roosevelt, as follows: "We condemn as a violation of the spirit of our institutions the action of the present chief executive in using the patronage of his high office to secure the nomination of one of his cabinet officers. A forced succession in the presidency is scarcely less repugnant to public sentiment than is life tenure in that office. No good intention on the part of the executive and no virtue in the one selected can justify the establishment of a dynasty."

If this be true, President Roosevelt should be impeached for misconduct in his high office, and I, as one, confidently brand this accusation as a brazen and cowardly falsehood, and would be glad if the democratic maligners of the president would produce facts and dates and make their charge definite.

If Mr. Bryan is sincere, he is no less dangerous to the nation's welfare. If sincere, he blundered in 1892 when he said that free silver was the only possible hope of restoring prosperity. He blundered in 1896 when he said on July 7th, in welcoming the Bryan home guards: "The fight this year will be to carry out the sentiment of that song we have so often repeated, 'My Country 'Tis of Thee; if we lose, our children will be carried to the land of the spirit of that song, and celebrations of the

Fourth of July will pass away, for the spirit of empire will be upon us." He blundered in 1904 when he accused President Roosevelt of selling out to the corporate influences, and of intending, because of his "brutal, bloody and barbarous sentiments" to plunge the nation into war and of relying on a riot of cartridges. He blundered in 1906 when in his homecoming speech at New York, he said, with reference to government ownership of railways, as follows: "I have already reached the conclusion that the railroads partake so much of the nature of a monopoly that they must ultimately become public property and be managed by public officials in the interest of the whole community in accordance with the well defined theory that public ownership is necessary where competition is impossible. \* \* \* I believe that an increasing number of the members of all parties see in public ownership the same remedy for discriminations between person and politics and for extortionate rates for the carrying of freight and passengers. Believing, however, that the operation of all the railroads by the federal government would result in a centralization which would all but obliterate state lines, I prefer to see the trunk lines operated by the federal government and the local lines by the several state governments."

**Is Bryan Desirable?**

The American people do not desire a blunderer for their president. Mr. Bryan has a charming personality. His moral life is clean; his neighborly qualities are excellent; and he is a fine type of the American Christian gentleman. But in personality, in cleanliness of moral character, in neighborly qualities, and in his Christianity, we yield no jot or tittle from our own candidate, for in these essentials the two gentlemen are on an exact par, and we are thankful to know, a very high plane of citizenship. But the republican party, however, is not compelled to present a candidate, whose solemn and unequivocal utterances and statements, if repeated at any time within two years after spoken, would make him ridiculous. On the contrary, we present a man who has had the most thorough and remarkable schooling in statesmanship that has ever fallen to the lot of a presidential aspirant; a man who is greater in brain and experience than anyone has ever been at the time of his nomination for the presidency; the best equipped man in America for the job—William H. Taft.

Candidate Bryan appeals especially to the farmers for campaign funds. This is a good deal like asking a man to buy a rope to hang himself with. Mr. Bryan appealed to the farmers in '92, to save themselves from being crushed by the tariff. He appealed to the farmers in '96, to save themselves from bankruptcy and poverty by adopting free silver.
